The End and the Beginning

But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. 2 Peter 3:18

Sometimes the month of November feels like just holding on until the holidays—just wait until we get to Advent and can finally start getting ready for Christmas and fun activities. It's getting colder and darker, and Thanksgiving dinner may mean either a lot of travel of a lot of cooking and cleaning the house.

Although giving thanks is a great practice any time of the year, I want to remember the other thing which is going on at this season of the church year: this is the end of the year (the Christian year begins with Advent), and we are invited to consider the end of time, and what that means for us and for the church. The last Sunday of the year (November 26, 2023) is variously known as Christ the King, or Eternity Sunday. Each of these titles describe what we know the end of time will be like in the reign of Christ. Natalie Sleeth captured this theological truth in the poem which is set to her music for "In the bulb there is a flower":

In our end is our beginning; in our time, infinity; In our doubt there is believing, in our life, eternity. In our death, a resurrection; at the last a victory.

Within the chilly days, long nights, and barren landscape of November is the promise of God's faithfulness and new life; every year that new life comes to us again in the form of Jesus Christ, God's Incarnate Word, born in a humble stable in Bethlehem. The story begins with a humble birth, and ends as Christ the Lord of All, and ruler of time and eternity. Christ the King is the end of the story, but it is also the beginning of a story which will never end. Halleluiah!

This year there is an opportunity which does not happen every year: there is a Sunday following American Thanksgiving before the beginning of Advent. At Creekside we will celebrate this as Christ the King Sunday, and remember in worship, prayer, and especially our music the proclamation that Christ is Lord, and that even when we do not know what the future holds, we know who holds the future. This is cause for rejoicing—whatever the season brings.

Blessings to you and your families as you prepare for Thanksgiving, and as you find ways to give thanks every day. We will have a feast of praise at the end of November: all are welcome, it is low-calorie, and there's very little clean up. What a joyous occasion!

FROM THE CHURCH BOARD:

This month the major topic of discussion was the 2024 Church Board budget. We also heard reports concerning the wall removal in the Sunday School classroom, stained glass, our Board goal of welcoming and providing activities for children and families, and the 2023 Love Offering.

The Budget for 2024 took up most of our meeting time. In the end, we put together a budget which has a 1.5% increase over last year, and includes a 3% increase to Pastor Rosanna's compensation package, as well as a 3% increase in pay for Marita Barsoda, our Administrative Assistant.

Roger Griffith reported the wall removal is complete. Thee Seekers Class has been meeting in the expanded space, and Fellowship Team is in the process of moving items into their storage room. Thanks to Ted Noffsinger, Mike Kauffman, & Roger Griffith for their hard work to complete this project.

The stained glass committee has been busy. Rosanna reported they have decided the location and dimensions of the windows, and will be working with artists Don and Carol Burling of Don's Custom Stained Glass in Granger. The project is fully funded; some of the windows will still be available to sponsor.

We will have a Love Offering at the end of this year for those who can donate over and above their regular giving to outreach projects. 50% will go to local organizations, and 50% will go to organizations which support international outreach. Outreach Team/Followers of Faith will make recommendations about which organization we will support.

Scott Harney reported on the Board Goal Committee's work for Trunk or Treat on Saturday, October 28. Along with New Life Sunday School class members, they will pass out candy, magnets with information about Creekside, and sponsor booths to share about ministries.

Reminder: November 19 is the Congregational Business Meeting. We will meet in the Gathering Area following worship that day.


EVERENCE

INFORMATION FROM FINANCE



The Finance Team had this graph created for several reasons. The most important is to say THANK YOU for your financial support of Creekside Church. There are many ways to give to Creekside, but financial giving is the easiest one for us to measure and quantify. This is a big picture view of personal giving; General Fund contributions are how we meet all of our yearly operational expenses.

In a campaign before we moved to our current building, a consultant told us, "Not equal gifts, but equal sacrifice." We are grateful to those who have much to give and are willing to share it, but we also need people who are willing to give what they can, not matter what the amount.

Find your household on this graph; could you move over to the right? If you are one of the households who attend regularly but made no financial gift in 2022, we pray that you would experience God's generosity and become a financial giver—whatever the amount of that gift. A note about how this graph was created: it is based on giving for 2022; we used total yearly giving and divided by 12. Numbers and households for 2023 might be somewhat different, but our aim was to share general information, not a specific giving record. If you have questions about your personal giving, consult the giving statement which you received in September, or call the Creekside office. No one on the Finance Team knows names related to specific gifts on this graph or otherwise, but we would be happy to answer questions about how we handle finances at Creekside.

The Bee Line

It's déjà vu time at Beeline. Remember the fun we had with our children when we would play peek-a-boo? One of the best times was when we would take a spoon full of food and fly it into their mouths. When the game became tiring for us and we quit and cleared their tray, they often cried their little hearts out. Those cries may even turn into a temper tantrum.

Well, this year's honey harvest turned into a bee temper tantrum extraction day. Normally our girls (honey bees) are glad to see us and peacefully buzz around minding their own business. Well, this year they caught us in the act of stealing their food and had a temper tantrum, and we bee keepers paid for it.

Let me explain. We usually harvest the honey outdoors (on the table outside of the kitchen). Open air harvesting usually is not a problem. This year, the bees caught us in the act! It was a beautiful warm day. A few bees were flying around looking for a "treat" when they found us and their favorite food. Lickety-split they flew back to the hive, did their dance routine, and told the other bees exactly where they could find their favorite treasure.

Hundreds of bees came and visited us. They usually just sniff around. We cranked away, but when we disturbed their flight, WATCH OUT. You guessed it. But we won the battle! Ouch! However, in the process, each of us got a few stings – the cost of making our bees mad. This year we harvested almost 180 jars of honey and tithed 18 jars. You may purchase a pint jar (1½ pounds) for yourself now for \$8. Free tithe jars are available for you to share with someone who may be experiencing a rough time in their life and is in need of some love and kindness.

Don't delay! Get yours before we run out! We will again be selling our honey at the Osceola Methodist Christmas Bazaar on November 11. It's time for our bees to have a long winter's nap. Stay tuned for the details on how we prepare the hives for Michiana's cold and blustery winter.
