Cross Talk

If two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them. Matthew 18:19-20

You are no doubt aware that these are tumultuous years for churches, including those in the Church of the Brethren. Congregations, including some in our own N. Indiana District, have left the Church of the Brethren to join another denomination or to become independent. The reasons for these fractures are varied, but they are invariably painful, both for folks who leave and for those who choose to stay.

In my past year on the Mission and Ministry Board of the Church of the Brethren, I have had the opportunity to have a seat at the table. Most often we are hearing reports of conversations, rather than the actual conversations, but occasionally we hear directly from constituents. In October 2023, a group of concerned folks ranging in geography from California to Puerto Rico were guests of the Board on Zoom. Board members were encouraged ahead of time to listen respectfully and not to try to rush in with answers. After our session, we crafted a letter from the Board thanking our guests for their time and letting them know we had heard their concerns. This week, one of those guests sent a lament to ministers throughout the denomination, saying that the conversation with the Board in October was like "talking to a wall"--we didn't even try to answer their guestions!

What happened here? How could two groups of good faith experience the same conversation so differently? I believe that conflict is a fact of life; it can be destructive or it can be transformative, but conflict is present whether we acknowledge it or not. Theologian Bob Bowman had his own tongue-in-cheek version of Matthew 18:20: "Wherever two or three are

gathered in my name, there's bound to be a disagreement." Ephesians 4:19 encourages us to "speak the truth in love," but I believe we also have to listen to others' truth with love. Jesus Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, but if we get so focused on promoting our own understanding of that Truth that we cannot hear each other, we have lost our Way.

As we continue to walk through the season of Lent, our stories will take us closer to the cross. When Jesus was brought up on charges before the Sanhedrin and Pontius Pilate, he was accused by false witnesses and his testimony was twisted. He did not condemn his accusers, even when he was dying on the cross. Jesus' actions of love and forgiveness said more than the most eloquent words could have. It is so much easier to speak across one another than it is to embody the message of the cross; we need to speak and to listen with an open heart.

Their faith and resolve inspire me, and I am humbled by their hospitality. This is also part of the story of Easter and God's transformative power.

I will be at Mission and Ministry Board meetings the weekend of March 15-17. There is significant preparation before these meetings, and the Board began a 16 hour training in Kingian Nonviolence in October which we'll complete at this March meeting. District Moderator Paul Thomas will be the speaker at Creekside on the 17th, with the timely message of "What does it mean to be Brethren?" Paul entered the ministry after a career in public education.

Holy Week is the final week of Lent, just before Easter. Here are activities you can anticipate, and are warmly welcome to attend.


- Palm Sunday (Sunday, March 24) Palm Processional during 9:30 am service

The Bee Line

Did we make the right decisions in preparing our girls for this nasty winter? Remember, our honey bees are living creatures that are affected by the cold, cold weather. During the cold snap, I got out my heaviest winter coat, insulated the crawl space of our Michigan Basement, turned up the thermostat, and let the water trickle. So far so good!

Our bees need to maintain a 92 degree temperature in the hive. As Steve Barton said in the January newsletter, we wrapped each hive in black tar paper roofing felt. Why did we chose something that was black and not another color? To understand, we must learn a little about light.

The light from the sun reaches us in waves of different colors. Red waves are the longest; violet waves are the shortest. When the rays reach us they are all mixed up and we see white light. We can use a prism to separate light into its different colors (or let God do that when he gives us a rainbow).

When light shines on an object, some of these wavelengths [colors] are absorbed and others are reflected. To see the color red, all the colors *except* red (orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet) are absorbed by the object. The red wavelength of the light is reflected and that is what we see. (I'm not sure how God manages this, but He does.) When *all* the colors of the light are absorbed, we see the color black.

Now back to our hives. When they are covered with black roofing paper, all the sunlight with its heat is absorbed into the hive. So if the sun is shining on our hives in the middle of winter, our honey bees are warmed—at least a little bit.

Another factor is insulation: the better the insulation, the more heat will be retained by the hive. We perhaps should've installed better insulation on the hives this winter. Hive Blankets to insulate all 5 of our hives would've cost about \$150, but the replacement cost for one hive is about \$200. Time will tell if we made the correct decisions; we will "live and learn". (Remember, it's not unusual to lose 50% of the apiary.) Let this "Bee" the lesson: Honey Bees need all the wise help bee keepers can give.

Of course, we could use a few more "wise thinkers" as bee keepers here at Creekside.
