Practicing Tomato Presence

'Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.' Matthew 11:28

I am not a contemplative person by nature. There may be variety of reasons for this, including character and formation in a family which put high value on accomplishment. I have aspired to more prayer and quiet time over the years, with varied success, but have stumbled across it at work—of all places. Of course, I work at a church, which should make this simpler, but doesn't necessarily. Most people want their pastor to have quiet time, but they also want their pastor to keep up on administrative tasks, visitation, sermon preparation and meetings. I find it challenging to resist the lure of a long to-do list and the call of parishioners' expectations.

Fortunately, each season through late July into early September, I get to wash tomatoes. I show up to Creekside and stand outside the kitchen for an hour or so and watch the morning light spill across the meadow toward the beehives and down the sidewalk to the Prayer Garden. I listen to the hum of the air conditioner and the clatter of folks inside in the kitchen and the occasional call of hawks hunting on the property. I stand shoulder to shoulder with Ron Green in conversation or companionable non-conversation, and it is well with my soul. Not every day is sunny, not every situation is simple, but washing tomatoes creates a space for me to be mindful of my surroundings and of God's goodness.

Thee Seekers Class has been studying the classic *Practicing the Presence of God* by Brother Lawrence. He was given that name when he entered a Carmelite monastery at the age of 55, where he worked in the kitchen for 15 years. After his death in 1691, his writings were published. His writing reveals his conviction that the purpose of his life was to do the work of God, and that he found that work wherever he found himself. He wrote:

The time of business does not with me differ from the time of prayer; and in the noise and clutter of my kitchen, while several persons are at the same time calling for different things, I possess God in as great tranquility as if I were upon my knees at the Blessed Sacrament.

As we approach Labor Day, I encourage you to consider the intersection of work and worship. If you are retired, does the work you do at Creekside or elsewhere connect you to God's presence and goodness? If you are paid for your work, can you use your skills in ways that affirm God's work in your work? Resting in God may not be the same as collapsing on the sofa at the end of the day.

May you find God's work and God's rest, and remember God's goodness.

Our garden has been producing well—green beans, onions, peppers, squash, and especially tomatoes! Thanks to Cal Graber, Mike Kauffman, and other volunteers who have been working in the garden since May.

Unless announced differently, tomato processing is on Tuesday and Friday mornings at 9:00 am. Arrive whenever you are able and stay as long as you can; wear short sleeves and a shirt which can get messy the tomatoes are juicy (!) We have had GREAT help for the past two weeks, and expect at least two more weeks of tomatoes to cut and freeze for the Church Community Services food pantry. We have donated over 500 lbs of processed tomatoes so far this season! Diane Lund and Deb Kauffman have done a terrific job of preparation and clean-up for processing. It's a great opportunity to come to Creekside, visit with old friends, make some new ones, and provide a service to our community.

A NOTE FROM EVERENCE

Everence is again offering "FreedUp" sessions to member congregations. The "FreedUp" program is a way for everyone in a congregation to get their finances in order at any economic level – and gain a deeper faith perspective on their money. "FreedUp" is an appbased lesson series that includes a workbook and opportunities to share with others over seven weeks. Each person or couple completes lessons on their app and follows up for discussion with interactive small group sessions. Everence facilitators will lead the sessions, including the first get-acquainted session.

After signing up for the group sessions, you'll receive an email from Everence with the discount code and instructions to register and access the FreedUp app and workbook. Everence has a discount code to get the sessions for \$19 instead of the regular price of \$99. Session is Oct. 7 - Nov. 18: Mondays at 8 p.m. ET (Register by Oct. 3)

I (Larry) took the "Freed Up" course in Jan-Feb and thoroughly enjoyed it. Each session is one hour and are conducted via Zoom. You download the "Freed Up" app onto your smartphone to follow along. There is some reading and some watching of videos. I met so many inspiring fellow members of Mennonite and Brethren churches from Maine to Kansas in my class. You are welcome to look at the "Freed Up" booklet I used if think you might be interested in this.
