Change and Eternity

Listen, I will tell you a mystery! We will not all die, but we will all be changed. 1 Corinthians 15:51

One of my favorite fall activities is to track the changing trees which I see regularly. Most of these are on my property, on my way to work, or at Creekside. The maple to the east of our building is a perennial favorite, and figures prominently in the October Creekside calendar photo.

I know, of course, that these trees, and everything else in the natural world, are changing in every season, but in the fall, the change of foliage is noticeable, beautiful, and often dramatic. People are part of the process of change—sometimes joyfully, often reluctantly. Babies grow up and start walking, toddlers become school-age children, children—at least if their parents are fortunate—grow up and move out on their own. Older adults may move back in with family, or into independent living or skilled care. These may be changes we encourage, but the conditions which precipitate them are out of our control.

Organizations change, too. People come and go, programs begin and end, new opportunities present themselves. The church is not immune to change, but it is unique in that we position ourselves around a vision of a coming kingdom which will change the world. Forever. This vision is both a comfort and a challenge as the church changes: society is not the same as it was fifty years ago, the church has different people and different resources than it had in the past, and yet our faithful God is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. Christ's teaching and the New Testament vision of the kingdom of God has not changed; how we respond to that vision in today's reality is what must be flexible and creative.

In 1 Corinthians 15, Paul is talking about mortal death and eternal life. Death is inevitable—unless Christ returns before our allotted days are done. Change is an inevitable part of that process, and how and when that change will happen may be a mystery. We make plans as a church, we listen, we vision, look forward, plan activities and programs, seek to be faithful to our calling, and then go through the whole cycle again. We can anticipate and participate in change, but we cannot control it. Change is in the hands of our faithful and loving God, who walks beside us in every season. Yesterday is history, tomorrow is a mystery. We are called to follow Jesus Christ today so that we can spend eternity with Him.

Blessings to you in this season, and through all the seasons God has blessed us with. May Creekside continue to change as we follow Jesus' vision for the kingdom.

Please pray for me and for the work of MMB in October. I plan to attend a Pastor's Sabbath event at Camp Mack on October 21 and 22.

I was happy to be at N Indiana District Conference Sept. 20 & 21. Thanks to Ron and Jan Nicodemus for being our delegates, to Mike Kauffman who has just been elected to 3 more years on the District Board, to Marita Barsoda who serves on the Board from Rock Run Church, and to Roger Griffith who is the district treasurer. The Gifts and Placement Team from Creekside is working to fill our slate for fall of 2024; please consider ways which you might serve or represent Creekside in the future.

Creekside's fall congregational meeting will be Sunday, November 17, following worship. Adult Sunday School classes will not meet that day. Part of that meeting will be approving a budget for 2025—team leaders should return budget worksheets to Roger Griffith by October 12, 2024. Another part of the meeting will be to say *Thank you!* for your support of the Raise the Roof! capital campaign, and for your continuing support of ministries at Creekside. FROM THE CHURCH BOARD:

Creekside leadership has been approached by a Spanish-speaking house church, Elim Ministerio, about sharing space at Creekside. They are currently a group of 12-15 people. Pastor Rosanna and assistant Board chair Deana Ward have met with Elim representatives several times. Elim would like to meet in the Thee Seekers room from 9:30-10:30 am on Sunday mornings, join Creekside folks in the Gathering Area for fellowship, then meet in the Worship Center beginning around 10:45 for their worship service.

Before the Board gets into details of any agreement, we'd like to hear from the congregation. Do you think sharing our facility is consistent with Creekside's mission and vision? [You can read copies of these statements on the back of the directory, or summarized in the Gathering Area.] What opportunities might that create, and what would you want to know more about? The Board is sponsoring a Listening Session to consider those questions on Sunday, October 6. There will not be a vote at this meeting. The Board believes there should be a trial period before any long-term agreement is finalized. If the congregation is open to the idea, the Board is willing to invite Elim Ministerio on a trial basis prior to our November 17 Congregational Business Meeting.

Raise The Roof! We are barely a month into the Raise The Roof campaign and we've already exceeded \$20,000! Creekside members' generosity never ceases to amaze. The board and property team are hard at work on gathering referrals and making decisions on timing for quotes and making initial contact with roofing companies that in many cases were referred to us by our own members. While a new roof is surely not the most exciting event that Creekside has proposed and planned, the results of our capital campaign so far sure does highlight the spirit and passion of our members. One thing I've learned in my years at Creekside: when a need is identified, Creekside members rush to take care of that need. This is a shining example of "Everybody for the Body".

LOVE OFFERING/TITHE OF TIME

The Finance Team and Church Board have discussed a Love Offering for 2024; for the past few years, we have invited a special offering for local service organizations. Because we are currently in the midst of the Raise the Roof! capital campaign, we are proposing an alternative to financial gifts: a Tithe of Time. Outreach team is working with Church Community Services, Susanna's Kitchen, and SPA Ministries to give Creekside friends opportunities to volunteer their time in October, November, and December. - Tuesday, Oct. 22, 6:30-8:00 pm Soup of Success volunteer night at CCS on Oakland Ave. We need at least 12 people to assemble dry mixes for soup or dips. You may also shop the SOS store for mittens and candles assembled by this women's empowerment program. This evening is a great option for folks who have daytime work commitments. Volunteers will be seated indoors.

You may volunteer for any or all of these; we know that many of our Creekside members give time to other organizations, but these are opportunities for Creekside to be present with local ministry partners.

RAISE THE ROOF!

If you are thinking about (and I hope you are) making a donation to the Raise the Roof campaign to replace the roof of the church next year, I have some information which may make your donation more attractive. If you are at least 70½ years old and are still required to take a required minimum distribution (RMD) from any IRAs that you own, you probably understand that each time you take a distribution like that you will pay taxes on it when you file the following year. But if you take any part of your (RMD) as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), you will not pay a tax on that amount. Depending on the amount you choose, that could mean a difference of hundreds of dollars in taxes! Creekside Church is a qualified charity under the umbrella of the Church of the Brethren, so it qualifies as a recipient. If you have not taken your RMD for this year, you can still use part of the RMD amount for a donation in 2024. If you already have taken your 2024 RMD, you can wait until January to make your donation so it will count for 2025. To qualify, you cannot just write a check to Creekside; the check must come from the company which holds your IRA. If you have an investment adviser, he or she can help you with this. Otherwise, call the company where your IRAs are located and they will help you with the process. If you have any questions, see me. Roger Griffith is trying to arrange a session during the Sunday School hour in the next few weeks with an investment adviser from Everence who will be able to answer questions.

A NOTE FROM EVERENCE

Retirement may be a dream for many, but a recent study suggests it's not as joyful for everyone. A survey from insurance company MassMutual found a third of retired adults aren't happier since retiring. The survey gave insight into some patterns, including how 61% of the happier retirees said they had paid off all their debt at least five years before retiring, or how nearly half of the happier crowd said they prepared for retirement by taking steps to improve their health. Those much happier in retirement also fill their free time with activities, with 76% saying they spend their time with loved ones, 70% making sure they exercise and 63% pursuing hobbies.

The Bee Line

The harvest season is almost over. Much like the Creekside gardens, the "last fruits" of the Bee Team's labors have been realized. (Or should I say, "The fruits of our bees' labors" have been realized.) If you were able to attend the outdoor worship service on the 8th of September, you heard **Autumn Bee** (*represented by Madison Arnold*) express her frustration after working so hard all summer, just to have (us) "decimate" the hives. OUCH!

The Bee Team started to "spin the honey" in mid-September but we ran into resistance from the bees. I guess they talked to *Autumn Bee* and decided to fight back. Seriously though, they had gotten into the shed and occupied the boxes that were there so we brought them with us and the rest of them followed (see picture below of the bees swarming near the recycling at the kitchen door). To put a positive *buzz* on the experience, this year has been a year of learning. The harvest won't compare with previous years' results but we hope there will be some good things that come from what we've learned.

On still another positive note, it appears that the hives are all in very good shape. That is especially encouraging considering that all but one of them were new colonies. Two of them even originated from swarms that were captured and relocated. We'll treat the hives for mites and begin feeding them during the next few weeks so they have enough reserves for winter. It should also be of no surprise to anyone that our winters are not as severe as some have been in the past and our experience last year suggested that we may have "overprotected" our hives. As I described in January, we wrapped the hives snugly last year to prepare them for the frigid temperatures of winter but winter temperatures were on a roller coaster. It seems the hives got too warm during the day and the bees abruptly froze overnight.

There is still a lot of work to come for the Bee Team before bad weather hits. There is always room for more helpers.
