And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, Praising God and saying "Glory to God in the highest heaven!" Luke 2:13-14a

Advent is the season when the Church anticipates and prepares for the coming of Jesus as a baby born to a Jewish couple in the city of Bethlehem. This year at Creekside our Advent theme will be **Gloria**. We have purchased copies of the Brethren Press Advent devotional by Laura Stone, titled *Sing Gloria!* Here is a portion of her introduction:

When . . . scriptures and songs resonate, they hit particular spiritual frequencies that vibrate through each one of us differently. When they resonate through a community of Jesus-followers, or down through the generations, they vibrate with all kinds of spiritual frequencies that create a depth, fullness, and power that rings with a beautiful kind of magic God has crafted into creation.

This is one reason why we sing so much at Christmas, why we return again and again to the old stories, and why these stories and songs are so important to us. We have been created in such a way that we resonate with them. These stories and songs are keyed to resonate through our lives and amplify our faith and our life together, even as we amplify their meaning into the world.

In addition to the songs and stories of Advent and Christmas, our worship services will focus on the spiritual frequency of joy: not only how often it happens, but where it comes from, how we recognize it, and how it resonates within us when our hearts and lives are in tune. The children's messages will focus on various characters in the Christmas story and how they might have experienced joy. You will be invited to join your voices with the angels who proclaimed "Gloria in excelsis Deo!"

I love Laura's phrase, "the beautiful kind of magic God has crafted into creation." My prayer is that each of us would seek and find that kind of magic as we prepare for Christmas. Whether it is the joy of distant starlight or a quiet snowfall, the joy of gathering for worship with your church family, or the joy of welcoming a new baby to your family, these are all ways which we can resonate with God's joy and celebrate the joy of Jesus Christ.

Blessings to you and your family for this Christmas season. May you repeat the sounding joy of Christ's birth wherever you go.
