Tackling Hunger

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me." Matthew 25:35

Just before Christmas, a neighbor on our short cul-de-sac came to our house to see if we wanted to purchase his chainsaw. We didn't, but further conversation revealed that his daughter and son-in-law, who live at the house with him and his teenage grandsons, were both out of work, and the family was short of darn near everything. Our neighbor was doing what he could to be sure his grandsons had enough to eat. Although I'm aware of the widespread problem of food insecurity in Elkhart County and elsewhere, this interaction brought that challenge into focus for me in a different way.

My past two years serving on the board of Church Community Services provide regular reminder of the needs which CCS is working to address. Food pantry donations typically drop after the holidays, just when many families are experiencing the greatest need. No one can tackle hunger alone, but with strategic partnerships, anyone can help make a difference. This January through Sunday, Feb. 9, 2025 you are invited to bring canned soup to Creekside, which we will donate to CCS. February 9 is the NFL's final game of the season, the Super Bowl. The N. Indiana District, of which Creekside is a part, will have its own Souper Bowl: district churches will be invited to donate soup to the food distribution center of their choice, and the congregation which donates the most cans of soup will receive a Souper Bowl trophy.

Out of curiosity, I did some research to see how many NFL mascots are mentioned in the Bible. The Lions and Eagles are mentioned in the same verse (2 Samuel 1:23), as are the Raiders and the Commanders (1 Chronicles 12:21). The Chiefs are in 1 Kings 9:23; the Giants are mentioned in 2 Samuel 21:16, the Ravens in 1 Kings 17:24, and the Bears in 2 Kings 2:24. The Colts are in Genesis 32:15, as well as gospel accounts of Palm Sunday, and the Saints get a lot of shout-outs; my favorite is Romans 1:7. Although sea creatures, wild animals and birds get general coverage, there is no specific mention of Dolphins, Panthers or Seahawks. No sign of Jets, Buccaneers, Vikings, or 49ers. The Rams show up in Exodus 29:3; no franchise has chosen the Lambs as their mascot, but that would be a winner from a biblical perspective. The Lamb remains the unofficial mascot of the Anabaptist movement, as seen on the front of our blue hymnals.

No matter who you're rooting for this season, I hope you can join Creekside and other Church of the Brethren congregations in N. Indiana in the effort to tackle hunger. If this effort becomes competitive (and we are going to go hard at Creekside), everyone will win, especially the neighbors whom Jesus called us to serve. Thank you for being Jesus in the neighborhood.

RAISE THE ROOF AND OTHER PROPERTY UPDATES

Creekside's Property Team has been hard at work at the direction of the Church Board. Here are some reports as well as projects which are under consideration.

November: Hill T Construction made an initial cut in the parking lot, and on November 21 they were able to dig a trench for a new drain from the front of the church below the parking lot to the retention area by the river birch trees. Unseasonably warm weather allowed asphalt work to be completed that day (!) The soil erosion under the asphalt by the front pillars was less than we'd anticipated, which was great news. Final cost of \$5,700 has been paid from Capital Improvements Fund.

As prep work for the asphalt project, we had to have power and gas line locations on the property marked—many of these flags are still visible. It turns out there are lines running under where we had discussed putting the walking path, particularly the stretch of the path along the cemetery fence. Moving the path past the apple trees would run it through our garden plot, moving it to the other side of the garden would put it on ground which has significant elevation change. Putting the path over a gas line is a risk for puncturing the plastic conduit, which would be both a bad outcome and an expensive fix. The Church Board is respectfully returning Ron Nicodemus' request to install a walking path on the Creekside property. Neighbors and friends are always welcome to walk on the property as it is; we know that many of them do this already. Thanks to Ron for his research and passion for this project, and for his vision to reach out to our neighbors in this way.

December: Giving to Raise the Roof! has been robust: we can't say "thank you" often enough. Donations as of December 23rd are \$45,430.65, which is very close to our \$50,000 goal. This assures that we will <u>not</u> need to use funds from the William Pletcher Bequest in order to complete the roof project. We heard sharing at the congregational meeting about the need for Capital Improvement Funds; these are valid concerns. If we have no further donations to Raise the Roof! we can pay for the roof in 2025, but we will have very little left in reserve for future needs or emergencies. If you were planning a gift in 2025, or have been giving a regular weekly or monthly amount to Raise the Roof! we encourage you to continue with that giving. New gifts are welcome, too. 100% of these gifts will go to Creekside's Capital Improvement Fund and be used for the new roof or for future projects.

Roger Griffith, Cal Graber, Mike Kauffman and Jason Ward reviewed quotes for the roof and have decided on a contractor. On December 11 they met with Jerry Martin to sign a contract. We have purchased the shingles for \$28,203 and they will be held until the work begins in May. Roofing will begin after May 12 and be completed before the end of May; we anticipate about two weeks or ten days of work. Jerry has guaranteed his current labor rate for May 2025.

Under consideration: When Creekside's facility was built in 2006, we got a quote on an electronic sign for the end of the driveway, and determined it was not feasible at that time, but would be something to look at in the future. We've revisited this periodically on Worship Team; our current sign limits us to publicizing a very limited amount of information for only one event at a time. The advent of another group meeting in our building makes this even more challenging. The Board discussed a new sign at the November meeting and authorized Property Team to get quotes on an electronic sign which would be the same size in the same place on the same base as the current sign. We already have electricity run to this area. Early estimates for an electronic sign are around \$18,000. The Board will be having further discussion about this project, and would be happy to hear your input or opinions.

ELIM / CREEKSIDE REPORT

Ministerio Elim, or Elim Ministries, is the Spanish-speaking independent congregation which has been meeting at Creekside on an interim basis since October of 2024. At the November congregational meeting, we agreed to invite Elim to worship at Creekside for 2025, with the option to extend that invitation each year as needed.

A communication team was appointed by Creekside's Church Board to work out the details of a Use Agreement, and to check in regularly with Elim folks to hear how it's going for them, and to share input from Creekside. That team is Mike Kauffman (Property, new member of Board), Deb Kauffman (Christian Education), Deana Ward (Board, Fellowship, Finance) and Pastor Rosanna (Worship, etc.). We have drafted and shared a Use Agreement which has been approved by the Board. We are hoping to have the agreements signed before the end of 2024 to go into effect Jan-Dec of 2025. We are requesting an offering of \$50/month from Elim for use of the building; Elim has agreed to this. Elim needs to carry its own liability insurance, and their presence will have a modest impact on Creekside's liability coverage. These details have taken a while to work out, and are still in process as I write this. Elim friends have been very gracious and appreciative through all our interactions.

Elim has been invited to reserve space outside of Sunday mornings at no charge with the same process and restrictions which apply to Creekside members. This process depends on events being noted on the master calendar in the Gathering Area—if you need to consult the master calendar remotely, there is a calendar which can be viewed, but not altered, through the website. Team meetings and church events do not need to have a Room Reservation Request filled out, but they should be written on the master calendar, <u>especially recurring ones</u>. Family or other gatherings **must** have a completed Room Request Form. These forms are on the right end of the Creekside mailboxes. As soon as you fill out the form and return it to Property chair Roger Griffith, <u>write your reserved times (beginning with set-up and ending with clean-up time)</u> on the master calendar. Reservations will be first come, first served. In some cases, such as two team meetings on the same evening, we can accommodate more than one group at a time. It all goes more smoothly if we are aware in advance of who will be here.
