Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. 1 John 4:7

God's love for us is a foundational part of our identity as Christians and followers of Jesus Christ. This is a truth which should be remembered and shared and celebrated. There is a corollary to this truth which is also important, and is explicated in 1 John 4: Let us love one another, <u>because</u> love is from God (italics mine). Just to be sure that the point is clear, the writer of 1 John states it in the negative: Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. Through the month of February, our worship services will be exploring not only God's love for us, but what we are called to do and how we are called to act toward one another for the love of God.

I found inspiration for this series in what may seem an unlikely place, *The Little Book of Lykke*, by Meik Wiking. Lykke (pronounced Loo-ka) is the Danish word for happiness; Wiking is the CEO of the Happiness Research Institute in Copenhagen. His book shares things which he believes make people happy. The list bears a startling similarity to things which I believe we are called to practice as Christians: Community, Kindness, and Trust, and it was interesting to read research data about these topics. I do not think that loving one another is prescriptive, "do this, this and this"; we all experience God's love and express God's love in different ways, but those ways have some common patterns. We all know and have experienced patterns which are not loving, and how challenging it can be to embody God's love.

Rather than trying to tell you what to <u>do</u>, I hope we can reflect together on what we yearn for for ourselves and our family of faith. Consider the following:

If you want to build a ship, don't drum up people to collect wood and don't assign them tasks and work, but rather teach them to long for the endless immensity of the sea.

- Antoine de Saint Exupéry

I believe that sharing God's love should be more than a program or a sermon series; it is an expression of our longing for something immense and beyond ourselves.

February 17 is Random Acts of Kindness Day. If you have a story of giving or receiving an act of kindness which you'd be willing to share, please contact me or Worship Team chair Diane Lund by February 9 so we can hear your story on Sunday, February 16. You will have other opportunities in the coming months to interact with your church family and your neighbors for the love of God.

FROM THE CHURCH BOARD:

The Church Board has affirmed leadership for the new year; officers for 2025 are Board chair Deana Ward, Assistant chair Mike Kauffman, and Treasurer Roger Griffith. Our thanks to Scott Harney for his leadership in 2024, during challenges with his parents' care.

We are grateful for your giving to Raise the Roof! since September of 2024. By January 15 we reached and exceeded our goal of \$50,000—and we're still counting. Thank you! Work on the roof will begin in mid-May 2025.

We now have a signed Use Agreement with Elim Ministries (Ministerio Elim). The most challenging part of the process was getting insurance coverage in place for Elim, and that is almost done. The Communication Team (Deana Ward, Mike and Deb Kauffman, Pastor Rosanna) will continue to meet regularly with Elim representatives. If you have questions or concerns, please talk to one of these team members so we can share with the appropriate parties. A copy of the Use Agreement is available in the office.

The Board has received three quotes for an EMC (Electronic Messaging Center) sign insert which would replace the movable letter portion of the permanent sign at the end of the driveway. The total cost would be about \$20,500, including permits and variances. We already have 20% of the needed funds from a gift for a previous project which was re-assigned by the donor. We are considering other funds, including a grant from the Creekside Mission and Vision fund. We do not plan to use Capital Improvements funds for this project. If you'd like to know more about the proposed sign, talk to Mike Kauffman or Roger Griffith. This has been a wish-list item for Creekside Church since the building was constructed in 2006; we think it will help increase our visibility in the neighborhood, and allow us to publicize several events at once, including Elim Ministry worship.

The Board has begun conversations about longer-range planning (3-5 years or more); this includes considering the best use of Pletcher bequest funds. Please be in prayer for those ongoing conversations and planning, and let a Board member know if you have ideas. Anyone is welcome to attend Board meetings; they are typically the third Thursday of the month at 6:30 pm.

We have a great board, including our newest members, Karen Snyder and Mike Kauffman, who were elected in November. Scott Harney, Tim Morphew, and Kurt Vardaman are continuing as board members, and Pastor Rosanna is an ex officio member. These leaders are committed using their gifts at Creekside Church. Thanks for encouraging them in their work.

The Bee Line

It's a **cold** morning in January and I just finished the last few drops of our delicious *Creekside* honey this morning. Jean and I only had one jar this year and I hope those of you who wanted honey were able to get some. Our bees worked awfully hard this year to provide us with what we got. We also want to thank Peggy Emeis for her donation to the cause.

As I sat in our warm house and gazed outside at the snow, I couldn't help but think of our bees huddled together in their hive to keep warm. The drones have all been driven out or died by now because the colony is in survival mode for the winter. Beekeepers have differing opinions on what to do for the bees during the winter but many sources agree that bees are very good at taking care of themselves. They form a cluster and maintain a temperature of about 90 degrees (F) in the center of the colony. We hope that our girls can do that.

I mentioned in October's Connection that wrapping the hives the previous year may have caused problems when the temperatures went up and down. We didn't do that this fall and so far, the temperatures have been about what we would expect for this time of year. I also mentioned last year that it was a year of learning. I hope that what we learned will help our bees.

Like farmers do in the wintertime, beekeepers think ahead to warmer weather and the work ahead. Ron has already ordered frames for the top of the hive boxes designed to allow us to provide food for the bees late in the winter months when their food supply is depleted. If we have a few good days in February or March, we'll place the frames on top and add a generous layer of sugar for the bees to take back into the hive. We have to be careful that we don't open the hive too soon and expose the hive to freezing temperatures.

There is work still to come for the Bee Team but I personally am looking forward to getting back out and having them greet me on a sunny day. Consider joining one of us and get acquainted with the girls this year. There is always room for more helpers.
