Each Annual Conference includes a Witness to the Host City opportunity— I'm sure you remember last year's donation of fleece blankets through Harney's leadership of the children's activities! This year's benefiting organization is Backpack Beginnings (see more at backpackbeginnings.org) Congregations are invited to send school or hygiene supplies listed on the BPB website, or monetary donations. The BPB Family Market is a dignity of choice, "one-stop" shopping experience where parents and children select their basic needs at no cost in a retail-like, welcoming environment. We hope to be a blessing to the families of Greensboro.

Please hold Mike Kauffman in prayer as he prepares to serve as the delegate from Creekside Church. I will attend and have responsibilities as a member of the Mission and Ministry Board, but Mike is the only person who will be voting on business on behalf of our congregation. Deb Kauffman and Tim McFadden will also be attending, and on their behalf, I will express gratitude that camping is no longer part of that experience. Creekside's worship service on Sunday, July 6 will include Moderator Dava's opening sermon.

PATHFINDER TEAM

In January, Cal Graber submitted a written proposal to the Church Board and then met with them in person in March. His proposal was to create a committee to bring ideas to the Board for both new opportunities and future leadership at Creekside. The Board suggested people to be asked to serve on the team, and we met with Pastor Rosanna for the first time on May 1st. Pathfinder Team will present ideas within the next several months, or at least by the end of the year. This group is a subcommittee formed by and reportable to the Board, so we will be keeping them informed as we move forward. We have been authorized to use up to \$5,000 from the Mission & Vision Fund for grant writing, correspondence expenses, consulting, or other expenses related to clarifying our task.

We will be working with the church board to develop detailed plans to consider for strategic planning for ministries and leadership for Creekside and its long-term future. Realizing that new or expanded ministry and staffing will almost certainly need financial resources, we anticipate using money from the Bill Pletcher bequest fund. Some ideas were already suggested by the congregation at the congregational meeting in May 2024 but there were other resources suggested at our first meeting and we've been challenged to come up with new ideas for our June meeting. You are welcome to share ideas with any member of the team.

PENTECOST JUNE 8



Pentecost is the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit to Jesus' disciples, and the birth of the church; Pentecost is observed on the seventh Sunday after Easter. The biblical account of that day is Acts chapter 2. Pentecost colors are red, orange or yellow for the tongues of fire which rested above the disciples' heads, and white for the dove of the Holy Spirit. You are invited to wear these colors on June 8 as a sign of the Spirit's presence which is still with those who believe in and follow Jesus Christ.

FROM THE CHURCH BOARD:

It has been a busy month! Congregational Business Meeting, a new roof, and a new sign—all thanks to you. We expect the roof and sign to both be replaced by the end of May, and what a game changer that sign will be! We can let folks know about more than one upcoming event at a time. A big thanks to all who contributed to the Raise the Roof campaign, and those who helped upgrade our sign.

The congregational meeting went well. Thanks to everyone who contributed a report for a team. The reports remind everyone of all we've accomplished since the congregational meeting in the fall, and boy, can we do a lot in six months! If you are interested in helping out a team, look over what each one does and find your passion. In the meeting, we discussed allowing the Red Cross to use our building as a shelter site for those who need a place to stay for a few days after a disaster (tornado, flood, house fire, etc.). The conversation was mainly positive, but some have concerns about having pets in the building—both because of allergies and possible damage to the building. We will take these issues seriously as we have further discussion with the Red Cross. We also discussed allowing another congregation to meet in our building on Sunday afternoons; we heard fewer positive responses to this request. I felt that the general vibe was that we have enough on our plate right now, and tying up our church building every Sunday afternoon might infringe on our occasional Sunday afternoon activities (baby showers, deacon lunches, etc.).

Work has begun on the garden and we will soon be seeing the fruits (and vegetables!) of our labor. If interested in helping out, see Cal Graber or Mike Kauffman. Get your green thumbs on! And let's not forget our bee friends: we have 5 hives total; 3 were installed this month. Ron Nicodemus' bee test on May 18 was a fun and informative activity, with a bonus of delicious honey popcorn (thanks, Jan!)

Once again, a big thank you to all who contribute time, resources, or both in order to make our church run so smoothly and allow us to do all of these wonderful things.

MISSION OPPORTUNITY

Sunday, June 29 will be an opportunity for you to learn more about a ministry which Creekside has supported for years. Judy and Stephen De Pue's daughter will be our guest speaker for morning worship, and will host a question and answer time in the Gathering Area during the Sunday School time. Everyone is invited to attend; there will be no adult Sunday School classes that day.

Here is some background on the ministry from De Pue's daughter M and her husband J. We are abbreviating their names because of the sensitive nature of their work and some of the countries to which they travel: M is the coordinator for Asiam countries, and J works in the Middle East:

M & J work for SIL Global, a sister organization of Wycliffe Bible Translators, founded to work internationally. M & J serve on SIL's Global Trauma Healing Leadership Team. They are on the International Core Leadership/Advisory Team within SIL's larger Global Team. They lead healing groups, Initial and Advanced Equippings to train others, and mentor facilitators and trainers into more advanced positions in their areas and organizations. They are also key mentors and trainers for organizations in North America who seek to come alongside refugees who are resettled in this part of the globe. M is the International Coordinator of SIL's Story-Based Trauma Healing program.

They see Bible-based Trauma Healing as a continuation of Jesus's ministry to bind up the broken hearted. They love seeing breakthroughs, witnessing release, and seeing people taking steps on their journey of healing to the glory of God. It is a joy to watch people grasp the depth of God's desire to be in full relationship and that God cares about our whole being. He wants to be fully known for who he is and he wants to fully know us and care for us. Their ministry extends Jesus's work, both near and far.

M & J live in Dallas, Texas where they are raising 4 children elementary through high school age. M grew up in the Elkhart City Church and will be here to reconnect with our church family, give us the opportunity to learn more about Bible-based Trauma Healing, and raise support for their international ministry. Outreach Team and Thee Seekers Class are the current supporting groups from Creekside.

I hope you learned a little something about the honeybees during the *World Honeybee Day* recognition in May. How did you do with Ron's quiz? If you didn't know all the answers, don't feel badly. I didn't know some of them either. Since I started "googling" information about bees, my smart phone must know that I <u>need</u> to know more about them because I get newsfeeds (I guess that's what they're called) from all over the world with stories about honeybees. Ninety percent of them are disastrous reports about hive losses.

While the Bee Team at Creekside feels badly about losing sixty percent of our bees over the winter, I think we can take solace in knowing that we're no worse off than experienced or professional beekeepers worldwide. Even better... we have two very healthy hives that survived! We didn't see signs of a massive die-off in the hives so I'd like to imagine that at least one colony was able to relocate and survived elsewhere.

The season is off to a good start now with our three new colonies and we have a good feeling about the coming months. We have a couple new people who are interested in helping and learning more about bees and beekeeping. We can still use more help!

By the time you read this, we should have a few swarm boxes hung and waiting in case a swarm somewhere decides to relocate. (I hope Ron was able to tell you more about *swarms* and *swarm boxes* as well.) Did you volunteer to host one?
