Seeking the Spirit's Direction

"Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit." Galatians 5:25 NIV

My husband claims that "nobody knows how to read maps anymore." I suspect that he is mostly right, even though it isn't much of a comfort when I'm navigating on a road trip. Of course we have all been shaped by having apps and OnStar and satellite navigation which tells us what to do next, even when we don't have any idea where we are now. Finding direction for a group of people going toward a non-geographic goal has never been as simple as following a navigation system, no matter what clever acronyms we use for GPS. This does not mean that the church is without direction, but we need to develop the skill-set which fits our objective.

What is our objective? Part of Matthew 28, the Great Commission says, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Those words were spoken by Jesus as he ended his ministry on earth and passed that work on to his disciples. That mission has been before the Church for nearly 2,000 years, and there is no reason to believe that mission has changed. But method is another question: <u>How</u> do we partner with God? <u>Whom</u> are we called to make into disciples? <u>Where</u> does this need to happen? The Church has had to answer these questions in every age.

Sometimes I long for simple answers to these questions: just follow the GPS rather than having to figure out a map or some other kind of directions. But, of course, the process of figuring out how, and to whom, and where the Spirit is directing us is part of the mission. We are, as Paul wrote to the churches in Galatia, to be people who live by the Spirit and keep in step with the Spirit. This takes regular and intentional effort. Prayer is one way to think of this process, but listening, paying attention, and sharing with others are also in that mix. It is good to remember that we are working toward <u>God's</u> mission, not relying on our own skills or best guesses about where we should be going.

I hope you have had an opportunity to consider the yellow half-sheet titled "Seeking the Spirit's Direction" from the Pathfinder Team. There are copies in the Gathering Area and included with the email version of this newsletter. Your listening and engagement and sharing are important to this congregation. Thank you for your prayers for Creekside's future.

The Bee Line



Thank you for participating in our recent World Honeybee Day celebration. One of the questions on the quiz suggested that without pollination we would lose 1/3 of our food. BUT, some authorities are even suggesting that it might be as much as 60% of our food resources. Just this year, we replenished our loss of bees with the purchase of 2 Packages and 1 Nuc, at a cost of around \$500, just to stay in business. We are a self-supporting team at Creekside and are not part of the General Budget. Thank you for your support in purchasing our honey and for your donations to our Honey Bee Ministry.

In previous Beelines, we have mentioned the many problems Beekeepers fight on a regular basis: colony collapse, pesticides, American Foul Brood, mites, ants, mice, skunks, raccoons, etc. Careful hive management can protect our Apiary from many of these. Raising bees is not simply putting a hive in your backyard and forgetting it. Our team checks our hives regularly. We recently found one hive was missing a queen. Without a queen, the hive will soon die. Our remedy was to take a frame with queen cells from another hive and place it in the hive without a queen. (Eggs laid and fertilized by the queen are females, and the vast majority become worker bees. But a cell fed Royal Jelly will become a queen bee!)

Question #12 of the World Honey Bee Sunday quiz asked, "Should we continue to raise bees and do our part in feeding the world?" 100% of you said YES! Your support is greatly appreciated. Keep on the lookout for swarms and help us get some FREEBEES this year!
