Seeing the Future

There was a great multitude . . . from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages standing before the throne and before the Lamb. Revelation 7:9

Predicting the future has always been an unscientific exercise. Whether it's financial investing, sports betting, or the Farmer's Almanac, what we know for sure about the future is that we can't know for sure what is going to happen. We do our best to plan well, to anticipate what could go wrong and make back-up plans. New babies, weddings, a job change are all things we may look forward to, but have factors which we cannot control.

November is the month of the church year when we begin to look forward to the end of time as we know it, and beyond into God's eternity. The last Sunday of the church year, in late November, is known as Eternity Sunday, or Christ the King Sunday. For those of us in the United States, this is often the Sunday just before we celebrate Thanksgiving. It's an interesting intersection of harvest and hope and abundance.

You may recognize the image at the top of the page as the eighth and final stained glass (if you go from left to right) in Creekside's Worship Center. The concept came early, but the design took a little work, because it's a vision of eternity, and no one on our committee knew exactly what that looks like. We do get some clues from the book of Revelation, and that's where the inspiration for this design came from; specifically from Revelation 7:9: a vision of a great multitude of people, too many to count, from all tribes and people and languages. This echoes the celebration of Pentecost, the birth of the church, when people from all nations heard the good news of Jesus Christ in their own language. It's a vision of the future which we look toward but has clearly not yet arrived. As Christians, we are called not only to <u>look toward</u> a day when all people will be gathered at the throne of God, but to <u>work</u> toward a day when that is a reality.

In this season when we are reminded of the abundance of our own resources, we give thanks for the work which is happening for people of all languages and tribes—for Church of the Brethren members and organizations who are standing with immigrant communities in this country or shepherding Church of the Brethren congregations in S. Sudan, Haiti, the Dominican Republic, or India. The crown of this image proclaims that Christ is King, and that is the future we are headed for; the cross reminds us that it takes sacrifice to get there and that we are called to follow Christ, who made that sacrifice for us and for all people.

Blessings to you and your families as you celebrate this season. May we extend our thanks and generosity to the whole family of God.

We look forward to celebrating your work, and God's abundance through the harvest and what we have been given to share with our neighbors in need. Outreach Team has donated gently used coats (adult & children's sizes) to CCS food pantry. Followers of Faith gave \$1500 to Hearts United for Bristol. We have shared mutual aid with sisters and brothers in the Church of the Brethren who are suffering because of having a family member deported or detained because of immigration status. We have built another accessibility ramp through SAWs and have requests to build more in Elkhart County. We have been blessed and have blessed others through your generosity and skill.

You have been generous in sharing ideas with the Pathfinder Team as we discern what we are being called to be/do as a congregation over the next 3-5 years. Thank you for sharing ideas and imagination.

I have just completed Mission and Ministry Board meetings in Elgin, IL and am looking forward to a week in Florida with family—including some grandchildren. Advent planning is already underway (!) and Diane Lund and the Worship Team are beginning to coordinate special music and celebration of that season. The Church Board is preparing for our November congregational meeting (more in this Connection); my thanks to Deana Ward for her leadership in 2025. If a Gifts and Placement Team member has contacted you to see if you will serve in an elected role, I hope you said "Yes!"

I am looking forward to the Fall Festival on Nov. 1—planned by Christian Ed and Children's Activity director Jessica Prahl and the New Life class. A more somber observation of the season will happen during worship on Sun., Nov. 2 when we remember and celebrate the lives of friends who joined the communion of saints in the past year. Some of those losses are still fresh in our minds and our hearts.

I anticipate needing to make a trip to California in the coming months—possibly on short notice—to help my mother move into an assisted care setting at Hillcrest Homes. The timing will depend on availability of an apartment and her cooperation, neither of which is certain at this time. Thank you for your prayers as my family moves forward.

- We are changing how we handle our memorial donations. In the past we've asked the family what they would like the funds spent on. All current memorials will be handled that way. The new policy will put the funds in a general memorial donation fund. Creekside teams will be welcome to use the fund with Board approval.
- We will be collecting a Love Offering this year with proceeds given to SAWs, Susanna's Kitchen, SPA, and South Sudan. *More info in Love Offering article in this Connection.*
- We will finalize our 2026 budget and slate at the congregational meeting.

On a lighter note, we're also celebrating Jay Ganger's 92nd birthday that day! If you have questions about anything in this article, please talk to me or any board member. I hope you come to the meeting.

- Creekside's Mission Statement is familiar, but we could review it more often.
- We are generally doing a good job living into this mission; the easiest part to identify is our sharing through outreach, and organizations with whom we partner—CCS, SAWs, HUB, etc.
- Celebration could be both praise for the work of God through Christ in worship, but also markers in our lives and the life of this community which we celebrate together.
- Several groups mentioned seeking God's love through a gathering (perhaps including a meal) for fellowship and prayer, open to friends/neighbors as well as small groups, Bible study, prayer groups.
- Being is important, but we still have to do something.

We will schedule a Zoom meeting to gather input from folks who were not able to join us on the 12th. If you are not able to attend either of these meetings, we'd be happy to have your responses in writing; contact Pathfinder Team and we can share a worksheet with you electronically or as a paper copy.

We went over your responses with Colin Saxton, and will share them with the Church Board at their meeting on Oct. 16. It was our initial intention to have 1-2 clear suggestions in time for the November congregational meeting, but this task is much more involved than we expected; we will report our progress at the meeting. We welcome the support and prayers of the members and friends of the congregation.

A NOTE FROM EVERENCE

Although church membership is in decline, many who attend report doing so more than once a week. A study conducted by the Hartford Institute for Religion Research found 46% of American Christian churchgoers attend church services in multiple locations in person and/or online. The survey of 24,000 churchgoers found that increased online access as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic may have driven up multi-church attendance. The survey showed that most people who attend multiple services do so both in person & online, and that younger people were more likely to seek out multiple church communities.

A reminder for those of you who use Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) in making donations to Creekside [or any other 501(c)(3) organization]. If you are over 70½ years old and are required to make Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from an IRA, you know that money you take from your IRA that year becomes taxable and you pay taxes on it when you file the following April. By making contributions to Creekside through a QCD, that money becomes tax-exempt, so you will not pay taxes on that portion of your RMD. If you need more information about making QCDs, talk to your banker, financial rep, someone at the firm that takes care of your IRA, or a financial rep at Everence Financial in Goshen. For this year, I would suggest you make your QCD in Nov. or early Dec. at the latest so you are sure to qualify for the exemption for 2025 taxes and don't get caught up in a last-minute rush.
