"Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us."

The four Sundays before Christmas are the season of the Christian year known as Advent. In Latin, Advent means "coming," and this is a time of preparation for the coming of Christ—not at the end of time in clouds of glory on the throne of heaven, but coming to earth as God in the flesh, a baby born to human parents in some challenging circumstances.

The theme for Advent services at Creekside is Emmanuel: God With Us. Each Sunday we will consider a different biblical name of Jesus, including Prince of Peace, Messiah, and Light of the World. Many of these names are rooted in the Old Testament and Jewish expectations of a ruler and Savior who would rescue their nation from political occupation and oppression. These names carried specific expectations, and not all of these human expectations were met in the way in which people expected. That is a good lesson for us as we long for Jesus and long for our world to be different.

A resource for me in planning these services has been *Unwrapping the Names of Jesus* by Asheritah Ciuciu. The Advent devotional includes family resources and study guides which we will link for you if you wish to do further study on your own. In her introduction the author writes, "I must remind myself each year who Jesus is and why His birth is so miraculous—not because my mind doesn't know, but because my heart ceases to be amazed." Advent is a time to re-visit the wonder of Jesus' birth, and the reason for all the build-up of this season.

Special thanks to Diane Lund and the Worship Team who have been planning worship and music, and will again be decorating the Gathering Area and Worship Center to usher in this season of Advent. We have ordered Advent devotionals from Brethren Press, *Word Among Us,* by John Fillmore. Copies are available now at Creekside; please take one per household. There are enough to share with an interested friend or neighbor. These devotionals will take us from November 30 through to Epiphany on January 6.

God With Us is nothing new: God was with us yesterday and will be with us tomorrow. But God With Us is nothing to take for granted, either. For those who enter this season feeling sad or lonely or lost, an awareness of God's presence may be the only thing they can hang on to. It is the gift which will never leave us, whatever our circumstances, whatever the season.

May you be blessed by God's presence with us this Advent. Pastor Rosanna

WEATHER CANCELLATIONS

Wintry weather is a part of living in N. Indiana—or SW Michigan! We are grateful to our Property Team for making Creekside's parking lot and sidewalks as safe as possible, but depending on the timing of frozen precipitation, we may need to cancel services on a Sunday morning.

If we are canceling services, that decision will be made no later than 8:00 am Sunday morning. We will decide sooner if the forecast allows us to do so. Here's how to get information about a cancelation:

- Check the front page of Creekside's website: creeksidecob.com
- Watch WSBT or check their list of closings online.
- We will send a One Call Now message by phone, text, and email. If you do not currently receive
 messages through One Call Now, <u>you must opt in</u> to be included on a weather cancellation list.
 You may do this by contacting the Creekside office and providing the contact information you want
 us to use. We can create a list which is used only for weather cancellation notifications.
- Call Pastor Rosanna at home. I'd prefer this not be your first option. If we are having worship, I may not be available after 8:30 am.

If we ARE having worship on a snowy day, here are some things to be aware of:

- We will try to provide valet parking; look for the green flag in front of the stone pillars. Pull up to the front doors and someone will park your car for you.
- If conditions do not seem safe in your area, please do not venture out.
- You are always welcome to watch the livestream at *YouTube.com/CreeksideCoB* —our Media Team does a great job. (If worship is cancelled, there will not be a service to watch).

In mid June my Mom was diagnosed with cancer and we spent months going to various doctors trying to navigate the medical industry. In July, Scott's dad started declining in health and we spent most of our time back and forth to Rockville. On August 17th, we lost him. After months of appointments with my mom we lost her on September 18th.

We look back on the year and wonder how we made it through. I'm sure we are not the only people in the world to go through these rough times, in fact I'm positive of it. But while you're in the midst, it sure does feel like you are the only ones. But God is faithful, he places little rays of sunshine in our path. Our new grandson, an epic family vacation, our jobs which allowed us to spend an unlimited amount of time with our passing parents, our children who have been with us through it all. So how did we make it through? It was you! From restaurant gift cards while we were in the hotel, invitations to dinner, prayers, cards of encouragement, a place to stay, text messages at just the right time, visiting us $3\frac{1}{2}$ hours away at Scott's dad's funeral, cards, food, hugs, food, flowers, food... did I say food?

Philippians 2 says, "Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others."

Creekside has shown all of these and more to us over the past year. It is with our most humble and heartfelt gratitude that we Thank You for all you have done for us.

PATHFINDER REPORT

The Pathfinder Team would like to thank you, the congregation, for your participation and comments during our "small group" meetings which included a Zoom meeting in October. Coordinating meetings with various participants this summer became a challenge and delayed our progress.

Keeping in mind our mission of **Seek**, **Celebrate & Share**, one recurring sentiment expressed in all the groups was that outreach and sharing within the community is very important to Creekside. To paraphrase one response, "**Keep doing what we do well.**"

Other issues expressed were:

- Remaining financially strong.
- Utilizing current resources in a way that invites future generosity and possible bequest gifts.
- Adapting the congregation's structure to ensure it aligns with the mission and does not lead to over-dependence on the pastoral staff.

Based on what we heard from you, the team has a proposal for consideration by the Church Board:

- Continue to grow our partnerships with community agencies to meet community needs (e.g. CCS, women's shelters, SAWS, food banks, Seed to Feed gardens, etc.)
- Fund small group opportunities for young adults (20+ in our congregation); childcare provided.
- Provide more family activities for the community. (Family Jamboree, Fall Festival, etc.) Fund the activities and not charge to participate, making it available to all in the community.
- Develop publicity strategies (effective use of new sign and develop a brochure highlighting who we are and the activities we offer).
- Provide small group opportunities to connect (e.g. Bible Study, prayer groups, service projects or collaboration with external groups like AMBS for Bible study).
- Investigate the possibility of hiring someone to assist Pastor Rosanna in communicating with Elim Ministry and working together with the Hispanic community in Elkhart.
- Develop a strategy for future leadership.

(Please note that if you are interested in attending JUST worship on any day, you do not need to register for Conference. Single day registration is also available for a nominal fee.)

2026 Annual Conference Volunteer Opportunities

June 28 – July 2 Grand Wayne Convention Center, Fort Wayne

<u>Hospitality</u> –This year hospitality efforts will include (1) staffing at several tables (with games, puzzles, etc.) at the Convention Center, (2) greeters at the three conference hotels in downtown Fort Wayne (Sunday only), and (3) meal hosts – a new program where locals will take a group of up to 6 attendees to a meal in a downtown restaurant, providing an opportunity for food and fellowship – everyone will pay for their own meal.

<u>Ushers for Worship</u> – For opening worship on Sunday evening, we would like to have <u>all</u> of the ushers be local. You are also encouraged to sign up to usher during other services, including one for Manchester graduates. Training will be provided.

<u>Age Group Activities</u> – Volunteers are needed to help with our preschool children (including infants), as well as K-2nd grade and 3rd-5th grade. Will include onsite programming as well as field trips.

<u>Children's Lunch Prep</u> – Sack lunches will be provided for multiple age groups; food purchase, preparation, and/or delivery are all options for volunteers.

<u>Onsite Registration</u> – Assist the Coordinator with full-conference and daily registrations, as well as hand out nametags, etc. to pre-registered attendees.

<u>Silent Auction</u> – Provide those interested in bidding on Auction items with a Bidder number; answer questions as needed.

<u>First Aid</u> – Doctors, PAs, and nurses are needed to staff the onsite First Aid room, as well as serve one or more shifts on-call. A <u>CURRENT MEDICAL LICENSE IS REQUIRED</u>.

<u>Observers</u> – This is a new position, created for the 2025 Conference. Observers watch for Border Patrol or Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents, alerting Conference administrators if Federal agents have entered the building. Each shift will last two hours, and a commitment to three shifts is required. Training will be provided prior to the start of Conference.

Each of these positions will be scheduled in shifts of one or more hours, making it easy for you to contribute just the amount of time you have available.
