## *Seek, Celebrate, Share*

*Wise men from the East came to Jerusalem asking,  
"Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews?" Matthew 2:1b-2a*

The wise men, magi, or kings have a cameo appearance in Matthew's gospel, but they have figured large in our imaginations, celebrations, and nativity scenes. We don't know how many there were, but three gifts are mentioned; we don't know what animals came with them, but the Old Testament references camels; we don't know their names, but tradition has suggested Melchior, Caspar and Balthazar, regions they represent, and which gifts they bring. We certainly don't know how anyone could pin-point a particular house with star navigation, but it's certainly impressive.

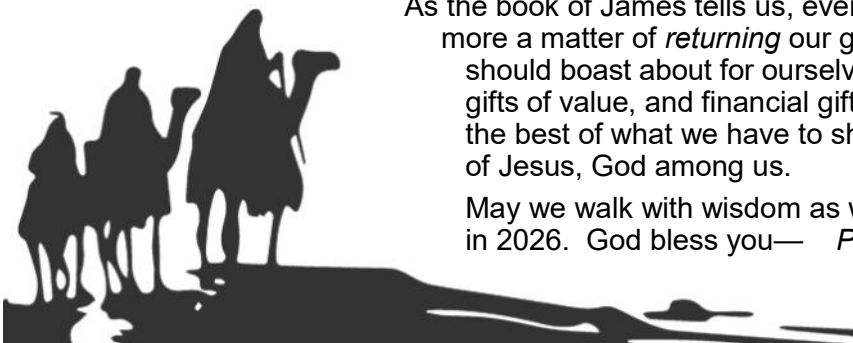
I like that there's so much about this story that we aren't told. Although we need to be aware of what is biblical and what is speculation, there is ample space for imagination and wonder. Our understanding of Christmas tends to emphasize our *preparation* for the birth of Jesus without considering what our response to the birth of Jesus should be. The wise men give us a chance to consider how believers behave when they find Jesus. Consider these verses from Matthew 2:9-11 in light of Creekside's mission statement to Seek, Celebrate, and Share. I have underlined some phrases to help you out:

They set out, and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen in the east, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

This is a pretty good guide for Creekside as we stand on the threshold of a new year. In order to get somewhere, we have to leave something—physically, emotionally, intellectually. If we try to keep everything we've had in the past, we're not going to get very far. We need to celebrate when we arrive at our destination, but also the landmarks along the way, markers that we are still following the right path and the star is still in front of us. We need to offer our gifts to Jesus.

As the book of James tells us, every good gift is from God, so this is more a matter of *returning* our gifts to God than it is anything we should boast about for ourselves. If we have been blessed with gifts of value, and financial gifts may be the least of these, that is the best of what we have to share as our response to the miracle of Jesus, God among us.

May we walk with wisdom as we seek, celebrate, and share in 2026. God bless you— *Pastor Rosanna*

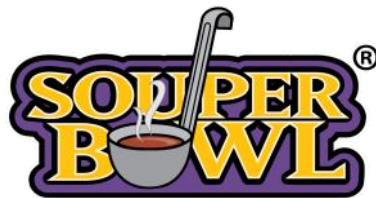

## A NOTE FROM EVERENCE

### More Young Adults are Reading the Bible

Research and anecdotal evidence indicate a slight shift: young Christians who desire a deeper and more authentic spiritual connection are returning to church or visiting for the first time. Christianity Today reports that while the reading habits of 18-29-year-olds have remained mostly the same over the past three years, more young men are reporting engagement with Scripture, and Bible reading is up 29% among American millennials, now in their 30s and early 40s. Millennials' reading habits lean print-heavy, though they also use digital tools, like apps on their phones. Meanwhile, Gen Z Christians are the least likely to read a printed Bible.
